

NCA Ethnography Division 2022 Awards Call

The Ethnography Division of the National Communication Association (NCA) invites nominations for the 2022 Ethnography Division Awards. All nominees must be members of the Ethnography Division both at the time of nomination and when receiving the award. In line with division bylaws and in conjunction with the recent approval by the membership of new career-oriented awards, nominations will be accepted for the following categories:

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

- Best Book (copyright dates 2020-2021)
- Best Journal Article (journal volumes with dates in 2020-2021)
- Best Book Chapter (copyright dates 2020-2021)
- Best Special Journal Issue (journal volumes with dates in 2020-2021)

STUDENT AWARD

Dissertation Award for Excellence in Ethnographic Research in a Doctoral Dissertation (dissertations fully completed within 2020-2021)

CAREER AWARDS

- Early Career Scholar (most recent degree awarded in 2011 or later)
- Mid-Career Scholar (most recent degree awarded in 2001 or later)
- Legacy Scholar (lifetime achievement award with most recent degree awarded before 2001)

All nominations for the Scholarship Awards and Dissertation Award should include a cover letter or letter of support specifying the award being sought and highlighting the qualifications and/or merit of the nominated work. Self-nominations are welcome.

For the book award, please send a PDF version of the book to Jimmie Manning at jimmiem@unr.edu along with the nomination letter. If a PDF version of the book is not available, please contact Jimmie to learn how you can submit your work for consideration.

For the journal article, book chapter, and dissertation awards, please send a PDF of the full article, chapter, or dissertation along with the nomination letter to Jimmie Manning at jimmiem@unr.edu.

For the special issue, please send the nomination letter to Jimmie Manning at jimmiem@unr.edu. He will be in touch about how to submit the work for review by the committee.

Finally, for the Career Awards, submit one letter of nomination (self-nominations are allowed), a current curriculum vita, and up to 3 pieces of scholarship or artistry that represent the candidate's full body of work. As a matter of fairness, please do not submit any extra materials. Winners for these awards are selected primarily based on outstanding contributions to ethnographic scholarship and artistry, although teaching and mentoring as well as service related to ethnography are also to be considered.

Although any NCA member may nominate a work, the authors of the nominated works must be registered members of the Ethnography Division at the time of nomination and at the time of receiving the award.

All nominations and supporting materials must be received by July 1, 2022.
