2020 RANKINGS FOR FEDERAL SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE R&D

In January 2020, the Consortium of Social Science Associations released its 2020 College and University Rankings for Federal Social and Behavioral Science R&D. These rankings highlight the top institutional recipients of research funding in the social and behavioral sciences. Data are derived from the 2018 National Center for Science and Education Statistics Higher Education Research and Development (HERD) Survey.

"Communication and Communications Technologies" combine with the fields of Education, Humanities, Law, Social Work, Visual and Performing Arts, and Other to comprise non-Science and Engineering fields. These disciplines received a combined total of \$1.2 billion in federal R&D funding. Of this, "Communication and Communication Technologies" received \$34.2 million. The top five institutions for federally financed R&D expenditures in "Communication and Communications Technologies" were as follows:
